The Challenge

Exeter completed the baseline supplier diversity spend analysis and identified barriers for diverse suppliers in policies and processes. We also identified internal barriers for MBE inclusion in bid solicitation. For example, the system required a vendor to serve the entire system to be considered. In addition, there was no portal for prospective businesses to be aware of contract opportunities.

Solutions



Solution One

Exeter worked with system leadership to revise and/or develop supplier diversity policies and processes to make them more equitable and inclusive. Specifically, we designed a vendor portal on the website, created a communications strategy to target local MBEs, and hosted workshops to connect supply chain leaders with the community (e.g., chambers, MBEs, faithbased organizations).

Solution Two

We also provided supplier diversity implicit bias training to contract owners to increase engagement and alignment with the supplier diversity strategy.

The Results

These initiatives resulted in quantifiable supplier diversity improvements in spend with diverse suppliers and impact on the community the system served. We identified and vetted additional MBEs across multiple categories. In addition, Exeter helped increase local MBE spend and impact in highpriority zip codes.
